



**ViCAP ALERT:
UNIDENTIFIED HOMICIDE VICTIM**

Attention: Homicide, Missing Persons, Sex Crimes and Crime Analysis Units

On October 30, 1995, the remains of an unidentified female, "Jane Doe", were found in a shallow grave in an open field in Albuquerque, New Mexico. She could have been in the field for 1-5 years.



Sex: Female

Age: 15 – 20 years

Height: 5'3" – 5'6"

Weight: 105 – 110 lbs

Distinguishing Characteristics:

The victim's head was never recovered. The lateral side of the victim's left fibula showed signs of a physical deformity.

Details of Discovery: A bow hunter who was target practicing in an open field in Albuquerque, New Mexico, located a bone partially sticking out of the ground. During further examination of the area, investigators located a shallow grave site containing the skeletal remains of an unidentified white female. After an examination of the skeletal remains, it was determined the victim could have been in the field 1–5 years prior to being discovered.
